We would like to sincerely thank Vibeke and Harald Lie for their generosity to support the development of IHA by contributing to a Halliwick film project. We hope that the project will be an opportunity to connect the Halliwick community, share experiences and discuss.

On behalf of myself and the Executive Committee, I would like to thank Katja Groleger Sršen for 13 years of cooperation and service. Katja was elected to the Executive in 2009, in 2011 she took the position of Vice-chairperson and in the years 2013 - 2018 she was leading our Association as a Chair when it was seated in the Netherlands. For several years, she supported us with her knowledge and experience, always helping to solve difficult problems with great substantive calmness and diplomacy. We also know that we can count on her help and support at any time.

I would like to thank my colleagues from both committees for their commitment and support, and all members of our association for the trust you place in us every year.

Report of IHA Executive Committee – Activity 2022

The General Meeting of the International Halliwick Association

The General Meeting was held in two parts due to the time already taken up (5hrs) and the lack of time for a protracted discussion of the last few agenda items.

Minutes of the GM (October 2, 2021, part 1) approved and signed by Chair Ann Gresswell (UK) and Secretaries: Ann Thomson (UK) and Hanne Bjørling (Denmark) were sent on January 5, 2022.

Second part of the IHA GM was held on February 5, 2022, in the on-line formula using the ZOOM platform. May 6 the Minutes were sent.

Membership fee stayed the same for 2 next years: Individual Member - 65 Euro and National Organisation or Recognised Group - 400 Euro.

Annual Report 2021

In January Exec started to prepare the IHA Annual Report for 2021. On March 29, the Annual Report 2021 with the Financial Report was accepted unanimously by Executive Committee Members.

The donation will be spent to produce a 30-40 minute movie about the Halliwick movement around the world and to point out how different people can benefit from the Halliwick concept. Small movies from each country/club/ member can be linked to this movie. The idea is to follow the movie with a book in English. There is also a proposal to raise more funds from EU projects for this idea.

Erasmus+ Project “*Let’s swim*”

There were a lot of activities, meetings, galas and courses during our 2-year project.

Ana Sršen wrote: “I believe that with the project we spread the knowledge of Halliwick and, more importantly, cheered up many swimmers who participated in our activities. With our project, we encouraged the development and interests of Halliwick in 2 neighbouring countries from the region: Bosnia and Herzegovina and Serbia.”

Website

Maintaining and updating the website, quick response to technical problems and threats related to data security turned out to be a huge challenge.

Courses and Participants in 2022:

- TOTAL number of **Foundation** courses: 56

Work since January 2022:

- Course reporting was converted from manual forms to online forms. This allows easier and more accurate tracking of the courses.
- The committee has pointed out that the next conference should take place around September 2023. Information regarding this, as well as suggested topics for the conference were sent to the Executive Committee.
- The committee held many discussions regarding the question "who can be a lecturer" following issues that arose. The position of the committee is that a lecturer can be a person certified by the association as a lecturer and who is a member of the association individually, through a group or through a national organisation. The committee began to discuss the question of membership in the association, but it was decided that this should be discussed by the executive committee.
- The committee discussed in depth the issue of training senior lecturers. Over the past few years there have been few advanced courses and we believe that training more senior lecturers will make it possible to increase this number. The small number of advanced courses does not allow lecturers to receive certification as senior lecturers, even though the committee is sure that they have the knowledge, experience and ability to receive this status. The committee drafted a proposal and sent it to all the lecturers. After receiving responses, it was decided to hold a joint meeting of all the lecturers and senior lecturers in order to make joint decisions.
- The committee discussed at length the issue of the funds remaining in the fund. One of the suggestions made was that the money be used as scholarships to encourage people to research, have special projects, case studies, etc. This suggestion will be brought up in the next General Meeting.

IHA Gala Subcommittee Annual Report 2022

GALA SUBCOMMITTEE MEETINGS:

The Gala Subcommittee held three online meetings during 2022. The first one was held in March and the conclusion of the meeting was that the IHA should own the Gala program and the Subcommittee made proposals on how to collect funds for the program maintenance over the year. Second meeting was held in May and the main topic of the meeting was creating documents for running Halliwick galas which would be compiled as a handbook from the existing documents. Third meeting was held in September with the main topic of running the Gala program. After the insight into the program proposals for improvements were given to Hanne Bjørling, Denmark.

ERASMUS + PROJECT LET'S SWIM

In the year 2022 ERASMUS+ “Let’s Swim” project was prolonged due to COVID-19 regulations and restrictions till the end of the year 2022. In 2022 due to softer COVID-19 regulations we were able to have meetings and activities co-organized by the project partners as part of the Erasmus + Let's Swim project and co-financed by the European Union. Partners face-to-face meeting was held in Velenje, Slovenia from April 8th to 10th. Halliwick advanced course “See, understand, answer” was held on April 20th to 24th in Orahovica, Croatia.

In autumn, the final version of "Gala competition guidelines" was developed with the participation of IHA Halliwick® Senior Lecturer Harald R. Lie and HASAM - The National Halliwick Organization in Denmark. The document explains in an accessible way the rules of conducting competitions in the handicap system at the level of club and international competitions. It also includes practical tips for preparing the event and a schedule for the organizers of the competition. The "Gala competition guidelines" will be on the IHA website for anyone interested in preparing the competition.

The finale of the two-year project was Halliwick “swimming competition with time handicap” held on a pool Novi Jelkovec in Zagreb between the partners of the project from Croatia, Poland, Slovenia, and Serbia held on October 1st with about 40 competitors from Croatia, Poland, and Slovenia. Partners from Serbia provided logistical assistance. Competition was held with a new trial version gala program. The Organising board of the Gala competition ran into issues regarding the new version of the program but problems were solved on the spot without much influence on the competition. Prior to the Halliwick gala on October 30th final partners team meeting was held in Zagreb.

GALA PROGRAM

During 2022 the communication with Danish HASAM was regular about the progress of running Gala program on virtual disk without any need of old windows versions or USB drive. Meeting with Hanne Bjørling was held by the end of September about running the version of the program and the first use of the trial version was in Zagreb on October 1st during the Gala competition. The Organising board of the competition ran into issues with the new program version regarding progression of the swimmers from heats to semifinals and finals as the program was unable to create new start lists. There was also the problem of using the program through a sign in profile created for Croatia, so we used the Hanne Bjørlings profile for the competition.

Halliwick “swimming competition with time handicap” was held successfully with the aforementioned issues. The report about the program was sent to Hanne Bjørling afterwards by Maciej Kampa.
